#### **COMMITTEE UPDATES**

Missions Update: Connie Jensen

The Circle of Nations was the focus of Missions in October and our congregation graciously raised \$410 for students in need of basic school and athletic materials.

For the month of November, Missions and LYO have partnered in Operation Christmas Child. An early donation allowed for the purchase of 24 durable gift boxes. Youth will fill those boxes with donated goods and items they purchase by spending monetary donations.

In December, we will hold a Gift Card Blizzard for families in need in Wilkin County. Please consider purchasing a gift card, minimum \$25 value, for a local grocery store, gas station or Wal-Mart. Let the Spirit of God's love continue to flow through Breckenridge Lutheran Church!

There has been discussion about changing the structure of our Missions outreach. Historically speaking, giving was strongest when we focused on global and local issues. Also considered is reducing efforts from 12 monthly drives to expanding the amount of time devoted to a resource from one to two months.
