My first experience with snow.



Vanco/Simply Giving is a third-party vendor who has made it easy to set up recurring payments/offerings to the church. However, did you know the church pays fees for every transaction made through Vanco/Simply Giving? Here's the breakdown:

Each Transaction 20¢
New/Change Transaction Fee
eCheck Fee .3% of total
Failed Transaction Fee 35¢

That means, if you are giving \$100 a month through Simply Giving, the church receives \$99.50.

How can you make sure the church receives 100% of your offering? Set up online bill pay through your personal bank. Most (if not all) banks have online banking available to their customers. Here's an example of how to set up a recurring payment through First Community Credit Union:



- 1. After you log into your online banking account, find a button/link that says "Bill Pay" and click on it.
- 2. A new screen should appear with your current payees or a place for you to add new payees. Type in "Breckenridge Lutheran Church" in the place to add a new payee and then click the button to Add that payee:



3. If it asks for an account number, type in your Envelope Number. Fill out the address, city, state, zip and phone number and then click the button to "Add Payee".

4. After the payee is added, you can either make a one time payment, or set up recurring payments. In FCCU online banking, there is an "Options" link below the payee's name. Once clicked, there is a place to set up Automatic Payments. Set the amount, frequency, start and end dates and then save the changes.





Setting up online bill pay therefore cuts out the middle man (3rd party vendor), and Breckenridge Lutheran Church gets 100% of your donation.

Another example: In November, Breckenridge Lutheran received \$8,596 from members using Simply Giving/Vanco. The church was then billed \$70.74 by Vanco/Simply Giving to use their services.


